Over the last 25 years, we've doubled California's footprint of native river habitat, bringing life back to nearly **20,000 acres**—the largest on-the-ground restoration footprint in the West. Still, only 5% of California's river ecosystems remain. By accelerating our pace and scale of restoration, we'll ensure a thriving future for people, wildlife, and our collective future.
