Position Description

The Assistant Wildland Seed Collection Manager works with Heritage Growers' (a venture of River Partners) and the River Partners science team to conduct field assessments of native seed availability and assist in the collection of source-identified wildland seed in the San Joaquin Valley, Tulare Basin and in other locations in California. The wildland seed collection process includes obtaining permission to collect, performing pre-collection field surveys, monitoring for ripeness, seed collection, seed conditioning, seed testing, and managing seed inventory. Many species will be collected and processed to support seed needs in the expanded floodplain restoration projects through River Partners seed amplification farm, Heritage Growers.



Flexibility, creativity, and problem-solving skills are required to determine the most efficient and effective method to identify, monitor and collect wildland seed. The position requires good botanical skills, the ability to determine when seed is ripe and ready to collect and careful documentation of the collection process. The majority of collections in the first year will occur in the San Joaquin Valley with other scouting and collect seed occurring in other locations in California. Collection locations will be more geographically spread out in future years. Approximately 50%-75% travel will be required during the collection season (March-November). Office work for this position includes, but is not limited to, assisting with data management, seed, and plant sales, documenting the collection process, and other administrative functions necessary to support the tracking and documentation of native seed collection and the administration and management of the Heritage Growers operation.

Essential Functions and Responsibilities

- Preparing permit applications to collect native seed
- Ability to have positive working relationships with various landowners and managers
- Monitoring seed for ripeness and determination of seed fill
- Manage seed collection crews
- Assistance with seed inventory management
- Interest in native seed and the development of best methods to collect, dry, and process native seed using a variety of methods
- Ability to work independently under the guidance of the Heritage Growers management team
- Detailed record keeping
- Ability to key out species with the Jepson Manual in the field in a timely manner
- Assist in reporting on weekly and yearly deliverables for contracts and grants
- Assist with native seed and plant sales including bidding and client coordination
- Collaborate with different departments of River Partners on collections across the state of CA
- Design and maintain geodatabase to meet organizational needs
- Other assignments as requested to achieve seed collection goals
- Ability to work long hours during the collection season sometimes in adverse weather conditions
